Betsy Clow Memorial Garden Dedicated in August

Eighty people gathered under beautiful skies on Friday, August 29, 2008 to dedicate the Betsy Clow Memorial Garden at the Front Street entrance of PWPL. Library visitors have noticed excavation and the construction of stone walls around two stately bur oak trees during the summer. All of this activity is the result of generous donations in tribute to Betsy Clow.

Betsy lived most of her life in Lake Forest, Illinois. In the 1940s she started to visit the Huron Mountain Club, and this tradition continued for over 60 years until her death in February 2005 at the age of 76. Friends and relatives wanted to develop a suitable memorial to Betsy with gifts to PWPL in her memory and asked the PWPL if a garden

beautiful cedar benches were built by the Carpenter Shop at the Huron Mountain Club. Her three children Emily, Taddy and K.C. helped with the selection of plants and assisted in the planning of the garden dedication ceremony.

The two bur oak trees were selected by City Arborist Paul Albert at a Wisconsin nursery, and City personnel transported the trees to Marquette. The Marquette Beautification Committee contributed matching funds for an Arbor Day Foundation grant that helped to pay for the trees. The excavation, wall construction and plantings were completed by Nagelkirk Landscaping. Master Gardener Carol Fitzgerald is maintaining the garden and will be placing additional plants in the garden.

Betsy loved Marquette County and her friends and family are confident that she would approve of a garden bearing her name. They are pleased that the addition of the garden will beautify the historic Peter White Public Library and will be a lasting gift to the residents of Marquette. ~

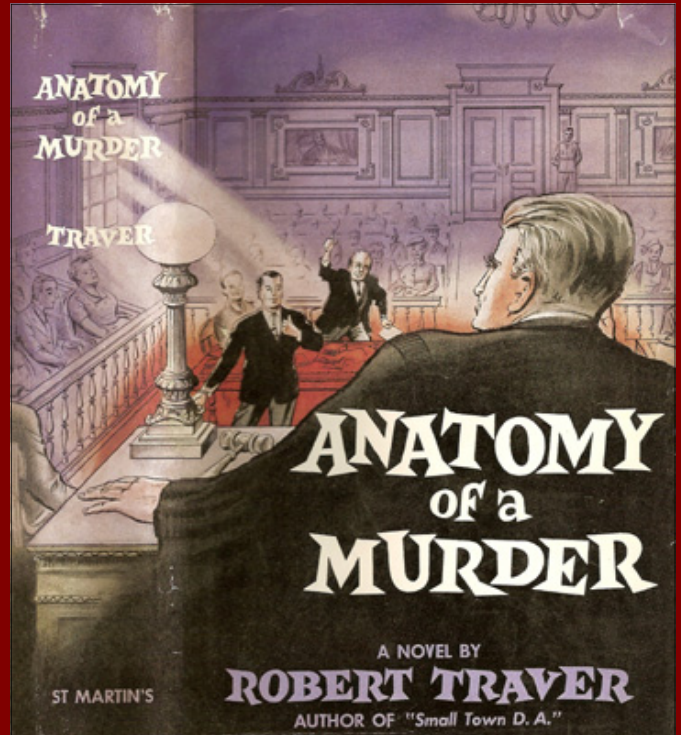
John Voelker Exhibits

What's Up with PWPL's Teen Advisory Board

There's big excitement among Teen Advisory Board (TAB) members this month, as the Library takes another step toward carving out a space designed especially for our teenage patrons. After the Board of Directors approved TAB's carefully-created plan to reconfigure and redecorate the Teen Area, TAB members helped maintenance staff move the teen fiction bookcases to create a cozier corner space. That simple change has made a big difference.

Although eager to continue moving ahead with their design plan, the teens understood that the budget situation required them to be patient...but that all changed when PWPL received a \$1000 State Librarian's Excellence Award, based in part on our successful teen program. TAB members were overjoyed to learn that PWPL Director Pam Christensen had dedicated the entire award to improving the Teen Area. Let the painting begin!

Alanna Luttenton, who specializes in faux and decorative finishes, began the weeklong project on

September 22. She and several TAB members put their heads together last month to create a bold, geometric design for one large wall, and a muted tone for the rest of the room. The teens will pitch in to add a few more splashes of color by painting the planters, hanging posters, and creating a showcase display. Middle school and high school students who have artwork or collections they'd like to display in the Teen Area should call Mary at 226-4323.

TAB members are planning a November Grand Opening celebration featuring food, drink, and music by local high school musicians. That evening we will officially christen the Teen Area with a brand new name. Stay tuned for more details!

Allegorical/Conceptual/Innovative is the name of exhibit opening in November in the Huron Mountain Club Gallery. It spotlights the work of three outstanding artists Diana Magnuson, Kathleen Conover and Mary Ann Beckwith.

Magnuson is a children's book illustrator for National and Trade Education Publishers. She believes in detail and uses it to explore mythological themes. Pencil and brush provide a sense of intimacy with characters, nature and history. Conover's contemporary watercolors explore nature-inspired themes, florals, classical subjects, symbolic imagery and abstract designs with sensitivity and depth. Beckwith, a professor of art at Michigan Technological University is a painter and teacher with a passion for both. Her experimental watercolor technique bursts with color texture and symbols. ~
