## Allyn Roberts Sets the Stage this Summer at PWPL

Professor Forest Roberts has been gone for a number of years now, but his memory lives on in the enthusiastic voices of children and teens at PWPL. Not only did Forest leave his mark on legions of NMU students; he is still influencing a love of oration, drama, theater, music and storytelling in a new generation. His son Allyn Roberts has, for the past two years, made a commitment to fund Summer Reading & Listening activities at the Peter White Public Library.

Past PWPL Trustee Robert Glenn was instrumental in steering the son of his NMU colleague toward such a gift. "Allyn is a great supporter of the Library and uses it regularly while he is in Marquette during the summer months. He has told me many times how much he appreciates the Peter White Public Library and said he would like to do something to instill in youth an appreciation for storytelling and drama."

Glenn brought together Roberts and Library Director Pam Christensen. The two determined the

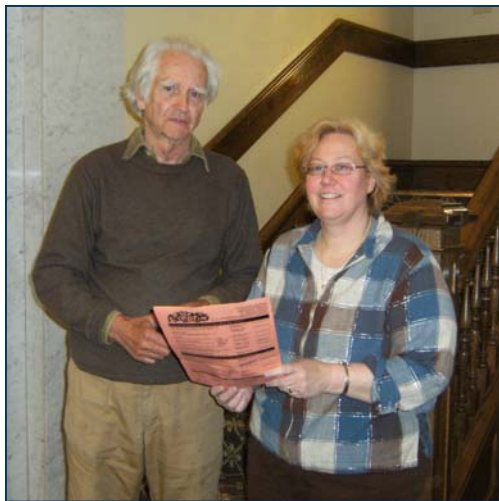
Summer Reading Program was the logical choice for his support and a wonderful partnership was formed.

With funding from the Roberts family, Summer Reading & Listening activities have expanded to include a myriad of activities. One of the most popular is *The Imagination Workshop* under the direction of Gale LaJoye. *The Imagination Workshop* stretches youthful imaginations through a combination of physical storytelling, pantomime, comedy and illusion.

Puppet shows are also a result of his Summer Reading & Listening program support. This year Red Bays and Jeff Spencer will present *Cinderella*. Live theatre will be featured when The Vertigo Theatre Company presents a Shakespeare Workshop. This contemporary look at Shakespeare will culminate in an

evening performance.

This year's Summer Reading & Listening Program theme is *Be Creative@Your Library*. Youth of all ages are sure to enjoy all of the creative offerings at the Peter White Public Library this summer. ~

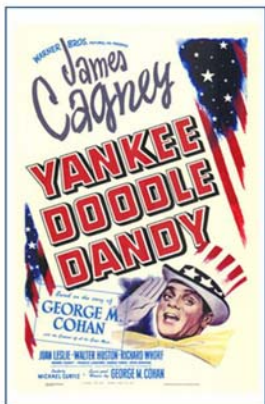
