1885: First settled in 1879, in township of same name. It is a station on the Peninsula div. of the C. & N.W. Ry, in the western part of Menominee county, 60 miles northwest of Menominee, the county seat, and 20 west of Spalding Junction. Iron Mountain is the nearest banking location. Iron mining is carried on in the vicinity and iron ore and lumber are exported. Methodist, Baptist and Catholic churches and district school are here and the *Iron Chronicle* is published. Population, 1,000. Exp., Am., Tel., W.U. Mail, daily. L.J. Kimball, postmaster.

1887-1888: First settled in 1879, in township of same name. It is a station on the Peninsula div. of the C. & N.W. Ry, in the western part of Menominee county, 60 miles northwest of Menominee, the county seat, and 20 west of Spalding Junction. Iron Mountain is the nearest banking location. Iron mining is carried on in the vicinity and iron ore and lumber are exported. Methodist, Baptist and Catholic churches and district school are here and the *Iron Chronicle* is published. Population, 2,500. Exp., Am., Tel., W.U. Mail, daily. Money order office. James H. Gee, postmaster.

1889: A mining settlement on the C. & N.W. Ry, in Norway township, Menominee county, 60 miles northwest of Menominee, the judicial seat, and 8 from Iron Mountain. It was originally settled in 1879, and has Catholic, Lutheran and Methodist churches. A weekly newspaper, the *Current*, is published. Exp., Am. Tel., W.U. Population, 3,000. Mail, daily. Money order office. James H. Gee, postmaster.

1891-1892: A mining settlement on the C. & N.W. Ry, in Norway township, Menominee county, 62 miles northwest of Menominee, the judicial seat, and 8 from Iron Mountain. It was originally settled in 1879, and has Catholic, Lutheran and Methodist churches. A weekly

newspaper, the *Current*, is published. Exp., Am. Tel., W.U. Population, 2,400. Money order office. R.M. Sampson, postmaster.

1895-1896: Population 4,000. On the C. & N.W. Ry., in southern part of Dickinson county, 9 miles from Iron Mountain, the county seat. Was originally settled in 1879, and has Baptist, Catholic, Lutheran and Methodist churches. A weekly newspaper, the *Current*, is published. Exp., Am. Tel., W.U. Money order office. J.H. Telephone, express and telegraph connection. Max Vielmetti, mayor. Samuel Perkins, postmaster.
